Hosted by Nathaniel and Alicia Gutierrez, the team will experience a diversity of ministries that feed into church planting—campus, mercy, and community—while gaining an insight into the beauty and culture of Peru and its people. Team Fee: \$2,500

Monterrey, Mexico: July 14-21

Hosted by Andres and Ruth Garza, the team will assist San Pedro Church in the running of a summer camp (VBS) for children while gaining insight into how a church serves as the base for outreach to all of Latin America. Team Fee: \$1,600

Note: World Missions covers 50 percent of team fees for adult church members.
